

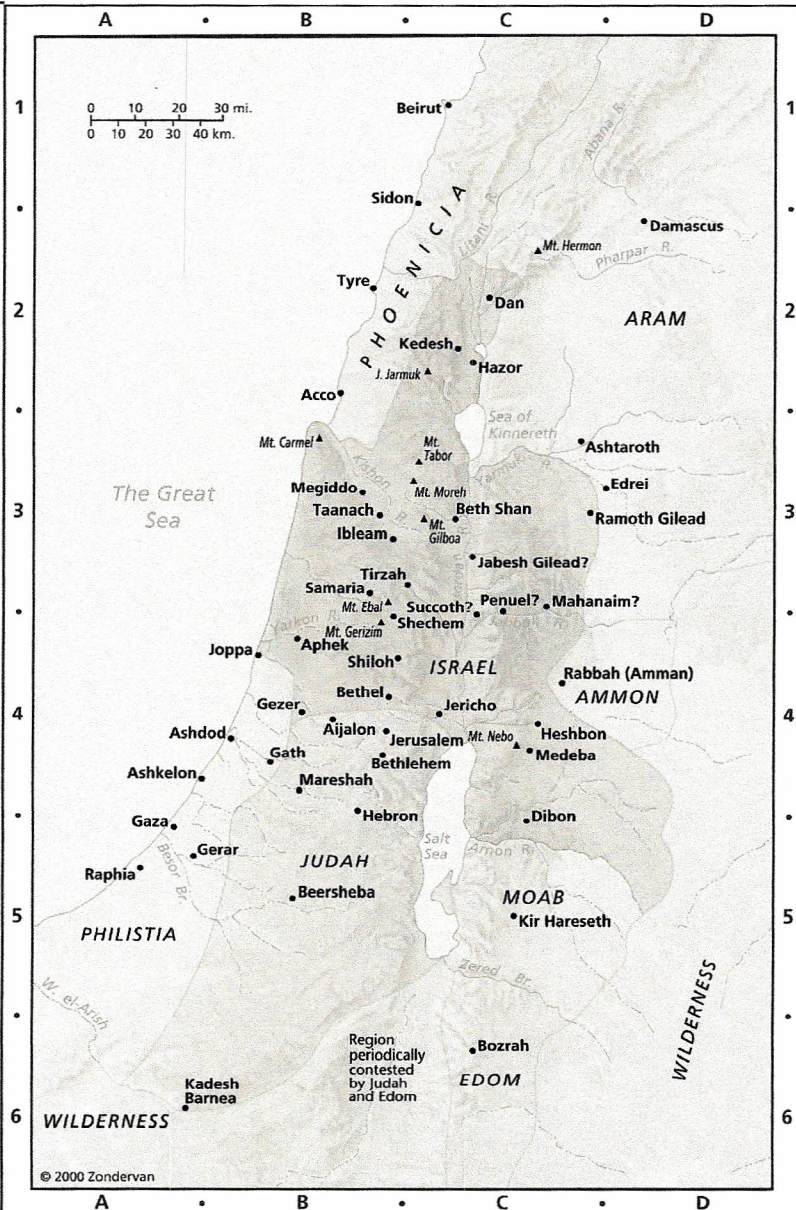
# 1 & 2 Kings

The reigns of David and Solomon take Israel to the apex of its political influence. Then, after Solomon's death, the kingdom splits in two. The result is separate kings and destinies.

Throughout this era, God speaks via His prophets, some of whom we meet in *1 & 2 Kings* (e.g. Elijah and Elisha). Later, we'll hear from other prophets also active during this time in books bearing their names (e.g. *Isaiah* and *Jeremiah*).

## LOOKING FORWARD TO JESUS

Scan the sidebar on the right entitled *Genealogy of Christ* and you'll notice that we encounter a significant portion of Jesus' lineage in *1 & 2 Kings*. Some of His ancestors exhibit Christ-like attributes, others don't. David (faithfulness) and Solomon (wisdom) display Christ-like qualities, but they clearly demonstrate human weakness and sinfulness as well.

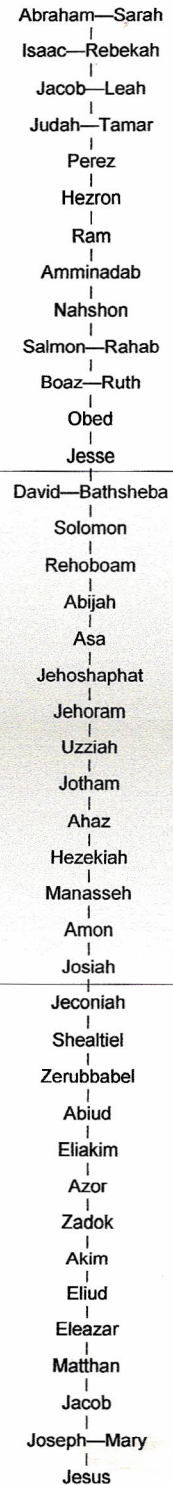
